Effective as of August 2, 1954, the Tesla organization adopts the official title

THE TESLA SOCIETY

The objectives of the TESLA SOCIETY are, of course, coincidental with the first proposals of the Tesla organization as outlined in November, 1953 when first founded.

The principal goal for 1954 and 1955 is increased membership; to expand the present select group into a profound following. Unquestionably, broader facilities and services, and widespread recognition coexist with a larger membership. The problem which presents itself is, therefore, subscribing new personalities into the Society as quickly as possible. Promptness in this objective is of some importance since the 100th anniversary of Tesla's birth in 1856 falls within two years. It would be particularly appropriate on the occasion of this Tesla Centenary to regain in America the recognition of Tesla that his great work here so rightfully deserves. The realization that there exists a Society of friends who share the same interest will provide a great stimulus toward the eventual success of this objective.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOW AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS AND FRIENDS OF
THE TESLA SOCIETY:

- 1) Facsimile of a 6-page typewritten paper dated June 19, 1926 comprising quoted statements by various scientists, engineers, writers, and officials of Tesla's achievements. (Quotes from Professor A. E. Kennelly, former A.I.E.E. President H. W. Buck, French author M. E. Girardeau, Yale Professor C. B. Richards, Dr. L. W. Austin, B. A. Behrend, etc...) On an occasion when a short paper was requested of Tesla concerning himself, he declined stating that he could not spare the time for its preparation. He asked that someone else prepare the paper, and for the trouble he would send twenty five dollars. The facsimile offered here is a reproduction of this 6-page paper.

- 2) Handsome portrait photograph. Inscribed, signed, and dated. Reads (across lower margin): "Compliments from Nikola Tesla, April 25, 1921." State size. (Maximum size 8" x 10")

- 3) Photostatic copy of a three-page letter of Tesla, addressed to Madam Glover, on Sunday, April 23, 1899. The letter is on the stationery of the Waldorf-Astoria. Tesla writes a courteous note, entirely in French, acknowledging the receipt of a letter of Mrs. Glover to him and which he had been unable to answer immediately. He regrets that he was not able to accept her hospitality as he was still indisposed, and the condition of his health had not changed very much. He hoped to see her soon, however.

- 4) Photostatic copy of a four-page letter of Tesla, addressed to Robert Underwood Johnson, on December 18, 1898. The letter is on the stationery of the Waldorf-Astoria. Tesla makes a quotation from a letter he received from Dr. Slaby: "I have been working recently on telegraphy without wires which you have so clearly and precisely described in your writings. It will interest you - as the father of this telegraphy to know" - - etc. (See Vol. I, No. 1, p. 9 of this Journal.)

O'NEILL & "PRODIGAL GENIUS"

When preparing the manuscript of "Prodigal Genius", Mr. O'Neill found it very difficult to locate material on Tesla. Tesla outlived his contemporaries, and families of deceased friends preserved little concerning him. Research manuscripts have drifted into various hands and have been scattered to the extent that they are not now traceable. Strange as it may seem, there are those who have collections of Tesla material but, for personal reasons, will not reveal them. It is not surprising then that errors have been found in the text of "Prodigal Genius" because information in several instances was either fragmentary or unconfirmable. The following is a tabulation of corrections for errors which have been found in the text of "Prodigal Genius" - The Life of Nikola Tesla by John J. O'Neill.

p. 125 The Tesla interview appearing in the ELECTRICAL REVIEW was for June 9, 1897, instead of the month of July as stated.

p. 178 The description of Tesla's "magnifying transmitter" should be corrected as follows: The circular fence like wall seventy-five feet in diameter is actually a portion of the secondary circuit instead of the primary circuit as stated. The lower end of the coil wound on the cylindrical skeletonized framework can be seen connected by a lead to the uppermost turn of the larger coil in several photographs. (This mode of joining the two portions of the secondary circuit is described in the Tesla patent 1,119,732, page 2, lines 93-100.) The primary circuit of the "magnifying transmitter" was 51 feet in diameter and buried in the ground.

p. 238 The Tesla statement described as unpublished appears in the ELECTRICAL EXPERIMENTER magazine for October, 1919, pp. 601-603.

p. 251 The article entitled "Mans Greatest Achievement" described as unpublished appears in the NEW YORK SUNDAY AMERICAN for July 6, 1930.

NOTE: Two excellent articles on the construction of vacuum tube type Tesla oscillators have appeared currently. One in POPULAR SCIENCE for August by Elbert Robberson, pp. 190-193-. The other in RADIO & TELEVISION NEWS by R. A. Kawcyn and T. G. Marshall, pp. 45, 98.

The theoretical and practical considerations which must be given to the design and construction of Tesla oscillators (previously announced for this issue) will be presented in a future issue.

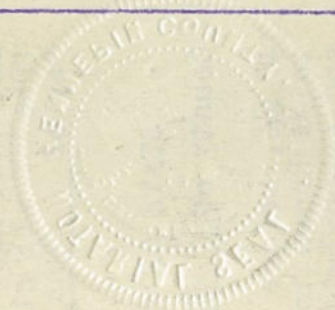

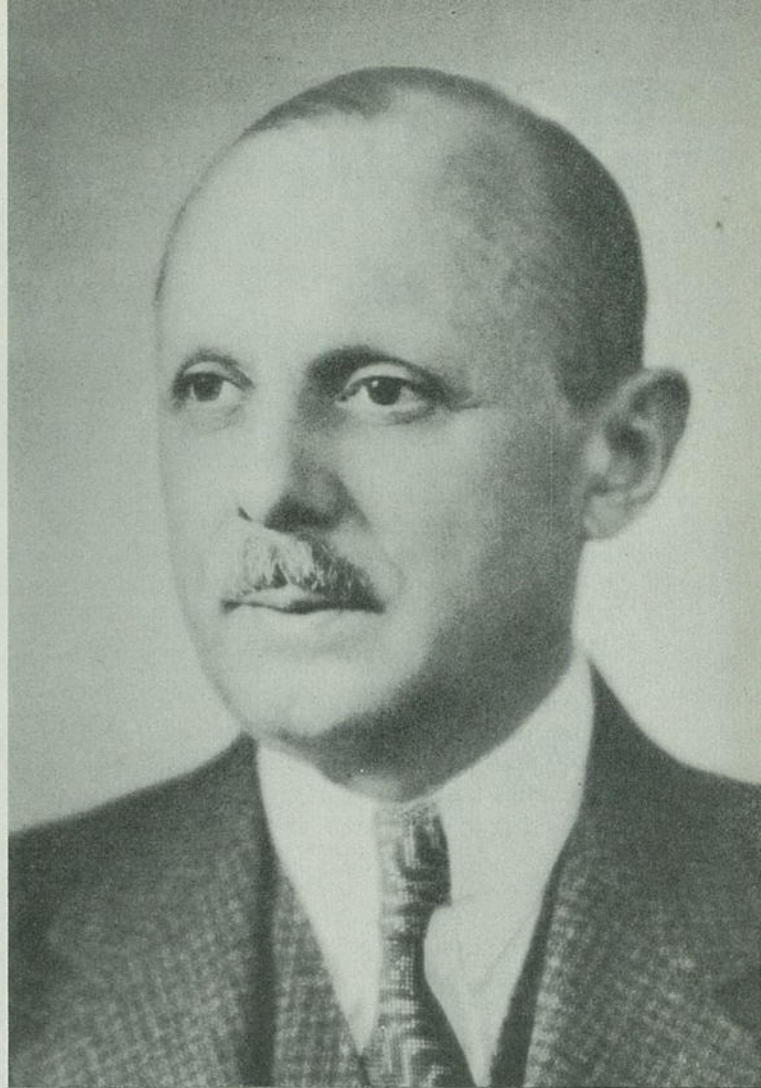

NOTED INVENTOR JOINS JACK & HEINTZ

● Jack & Heintz have recently made a valuable addition to their already excellent engineering staff by acquiring the exclusive services of the well known mathematician, inventor and gear expert Nikola Trbojevich. Mr. Trbojevich is a native of Yugoslavia and a graduate of the University of Budapest. After serving two years as an assistant to a chief engineer in Budapest, he came to the United States in 1914 for the purpose of taking a student engineering course with the Western Electric Company of Hawthorne, Illinois, and also to attend certain courses at the Northwestern University. He decided to stay here and obtained a position as an engineer with the Illinois Tool Works, Chicago, which he held from 1915 to 1920, during which time he became a gear expert. Since 1920 to date he has been an independent inventor and consulting engineer, and has acquired over 60 U. S. and many foreign patents. The most notable work of Mr. Trbojevich was the development of a new type of spiral bevel and hypoid gearing together with tools and machines for its manufacture, first published in 1923, which brought him international recognition. Based upon this work, and particularly his patents 1,465,149 to 1,465,151 and 1,647,157, the final drive mechanism of a majority of all cars, trucks, tanks, etc., used in the world today was improved.

Other inventions of Mr. Trbojevich are in the field of worm gears, steering gears, universal joints, pumps, gages, and gear cutting and grinding machines. A method of angle measurement, U. S. patent 2,134,062, which probably represents the simplest and most accurate method of angle measurement yet devised by anyone, is exclusively licensed by Mr. Trbojevich to another Cleveland concern, the Webber Gage Company. According to this method over 200,000 different angles may be constructed by using only thirteen wedge shaped measuring blocks and the accuracy obtained is of such a high order that the total angular error is usually less than that

represented by a chord one-eighth of an inch high, placed at a distance a mile away. Mr. Trbojevich has also worked out a somewhat similar system for measuring distances and believes that by using this system a new kind of measuring tool will be placed in the hands of the workers of the world. The object is to replace the present micrometers, tooth calipers, height gages, inside and outside vernier calipers, etc., by means of a universal and comparatively simple composite tool, at least ten times as accurate as any of the above mentioned tools, and thereby increase the accuracy of machining operations everywhere.

Mr. Trbojevich is a nephew of the late Dr. Nikola Tesla, the famous electrician.

Regarding Jack & Heintz, Inc., Mr. Trbojevich has the highest opinion of its humane and advanced fair treatment of the workers or "associates" and was attracted by it. He believes that Bill Jack is breaking a path by opening up a new vista of industrial peace, contentment, security, efficiency and good will among workers, which is bound to cause wide repercussions all over the world, just as Henry Ford's policies did thirty years ago.
